Trisagion

From the Greek = Three + Holy or thrice-holy hymn

One of the most ancient hymns of the church. As a general rule the regular Trisagion, "Holy is God! ..." is to be sung during every prayer or service.

In the days of Baptism, in the old days, "All You who have been baptized into Christ, ..." replaced the Trisagion. Today this is done 19 times during the year:

- (1) The day of the Nativity of Our Lord.
- (1) The second day of the Nativity of Our Lord if not on Sunday.
- (1) The Leave-taking of the Nativity of Our Lord if not on Sunday.
- (1) The second day of the Theophany of Our Lord if not on Sunday.
- (1) The Leave-taking of the Theophany of Our Lord if not on Sunday.
- (1) Saturday of Lazarus
- (1) Holy Saturday
- (1) The day of the Resurrection of Our Lord.
- (6) Monday to Saturday of the New Week.
- (1) Leave-taking of the Resurrection of Our Lord.
- (1) The day of the Pentecost.
- (1) The second day of Pentecost.
- (1) The Leave-taking of Pentecost.

For the solemnity of the Holy Cross the Trisagion is replaced by "To your Cross, we bow down in worship, ..." 4 times during the year:

- (1) The third Sunday of Lent.
- (1) August 1
- (1) September 14
- (1) September 21
